We encourage responsible sharing that aligns with our values of **respect**, **safety**, **inclusivity**, **and conservation**.

Sharing Your Adventures Responsibly

- Focus on the Experience Share the beauty, challenges, and joy of mountaineering, rather than exact locations.
- Do not share GPS coordinates, detailed routes, or hut locations this helps protect access agreements and prevents trespassing. Instead, use general references like the mountain range or region, and tag #MCSACapeTown & @mcsacapetown. Also add this message: "For information on how to access this amazing spot, visit www.mcsacapetown.co.za."
- Commercial Use & Promotion MCSA huts, meets, and properties are for personal enjoyment, not commercial gain.
- Do not use MCSA huts, meets, and properties for any commercial gain or advertising. This includes promoting personal channels/websites where there is potential for financial gain (e.g. YouTube).
- Respect Privacy Always get permission before posting images of others, especially minors.
- X Do not share personal details of members or landowners.
- Do not post photos of children or vulnerable adults without written consent or unless their faces are obscured.
- **☑ Drones & Wildlife** Our wilderness areas are sensitive ecosystems and private lands.
- No drones are allowed on MCSA properties in any capacity and consequently no drone footage may be shared on any platform, aligned with Cape Nature regulations.
- X Avoid posting photos of threatened or endangered species.
- ✓ Protect the Wilderness Let's showcase responsible mountaineering.
- Do not post content that glamorises risky behaviour (e.g. reckless climbing, fires in sensitive areas, littering, or other environmental harm).

Accountability

- Members should be aware of any personal legal liability they could incur by publishing restricted content on any platform. MCSA-CT reserves the right to suspend or terminate membership if members do not comply with these guidelines.
- By following these guidelines, you help protect our wild spaces, maintain good relationships with landowners, and keep our mountain adventures safe for everyone. Let's work together to keep MCSA-CT a place for exploration, respect, and community!
